How to plan my course pattern?

General Tips

- Remember to refer to the "Recommended Course Pattern" in the 2024-25
 Study Scheme and familiarize yourself with the compulsory courses
- Ask for senior students' opinion and get extra information
- Consult your academic advisor and find a comfortable pattern
- Consider if you will take a minor study and have to reserve time for minor courses
- Consider if you will apply for Leave of Absence to join Co-op/Exchange programme in year three: you may need to take more credits before that





Student shall be put on academic probation, a maximum of 12 units per term during first probation, and a maximum of 9 units per term during extended probation.




GPA < 1.0 (for 2 consecutive terms); or

 fails to obtain permission from the Major Programme concerned to continue studies; or

Fails to have probation lifted after being on academic probation for 2 consecutive terms;

Student shall be required to discontinue studies.

Plagiarism Detection




